aka web host, server setup, domain host

Hey hold on, you may or may not actually even need a web host. Some website platforms provide the web hosting as part of the monthly package. You will make this decision based on how much control over the core code you need, the monthly /yearly costs you can bear and what type of website you are creating.

# Website Platforms

aka website builders, carts, code, programming

When you're choosing the website platform it is vital to make a core decision between 3 major different types of websites:

## Marketing & Lead Generation Websites

If you are primarily [B2B](#), informational, blogging, doing product promotion, displaying products or portfolio pics, generating leads, creating marketing funnels, educating customers or using splash pages

## Online Sales & Shopping Cart Websites

If you are primarily [B2C](#), selling your products directly to public customers or converting instagram / facebook leads to sales. You can still have a blog and splash pages but your primary goal is sales.

## Web Apps & Online Business Websites

If you are creating a [SASS](#), online business software, online customer services, monthly subscription services, code buckets, api's or other web apps

# Marketing & Lead Generation Websites

aka website builders, web building tools

The major considerations for marketing and lead generation websites are a user-friendly backend (WSIWYG) for editing, the monthly / annual costs, the need for a server, user support the control/access to the source code & how often / easily updates will be made to the code

### Web Hosting

We always highly recommend using Bluehost for the server if it is needed. For web apps we would consider switching to AWS for complete server setup access



### Website Platforms

For **Marketing Lead Generation** informational ebsites we will develop with either wordpress or our own custom WMM depending on the company ARR level and future growth projections. Some companies also prefer the Wordpress SEO tools over the inherent security vulnerabilities



For **Shopping Cart Storefronts** websites we always try to drive folks to shopify as long as they can handle the monthly fees and costs per transaction.



Enterprise level customers may want to consider magento but it's a beast that will need a full team to manage and set-up properly.



For **Web Apps** we highly recommend laravel with its PHP based programming. We are also open to using angular depending on the end needs.
